### SR 520 Bridge Closed This Weekend for Annual Inspection

From 11 p.m. on Friday, June 19 to 5 a.m. on Monday, June 22 we will close the SR 520 bridge to conduct [annual inspection and maintenance](#). SR 520 will be closed from Montlake Boulevard E in Seattle to 92nd Avenue NE in Clyde Hill. Seattle drivers will be able to use SR 520 from I-5 to Montlake Boulevard E. Eastside drivers traveling westbound will be able to exit at 92nd Avenue NE.

Plan ahead and give yourself extra time to cross Lake Washington this weekend during the closure since it's likely that alternate routes like I-90, SR 522 and I-405 will have more traffic during the weekend closure.

You should also be aware of a [number of events](#) taking place around the central Puget Sound region this weekend, including Mariners home games on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, and the LIVESTRONG Challenge bicycle race that will close the I-90 floating bridge express lanes from 5:00 to 9:30 a.m. on Sunday, June 21.

### 2nd Avenue Construction – Begins Next Week from Pike Street to Jackson Street

During the week of June 22 construction crews will begin work on Second Avenue, moving between Pike Street and South Jackson Street through the fall of 2009.

This project will provide new concrete panels and reconstructed areas of roadway, upgraded curb ramps, sidewalk repair, restriping of lane markings and minor drainage improvements. The funding for this project is provided by the Bridging the Gap Transportation Levy approved by Seattle voters in 2006.
