Lynnwood Link (Light Rail) Extension

Lynnwood, Mountlake Terrace, and Shoreline connect to Seattle Coming Fall 2024

New Link light rail stations open in Lynnwood, Mountlake Terrace, and Shoreline.



Sample projected travel times:

- Lynnwood to Westlake (downtown Seattle): 28 minutes
- Shoreline South/148th to University of Washington: 11 minutes





King County Metro RapidRide G

Downtown-First Hill-Capitol Hill-Madison Valley (Seattle)

Coming Fall 2024

The RapidRide G Line project brings new, reliable, and frequent bus service through investments in bus only lanes and bus priority at traffic signals to reduce travel time (by 5 minutes from Colman Dock to Madison Valley). Buses will come every 6 minutes during peak times.

4th Ave Mobility Improvements Downtown Seattle

Coming in 2024

SDOT is upgrading the protected bike lane on 4th Ave between Vine St and Jefferson St. SDOT will be removing the paint and posts and installing concrete barriers within the existing painted buffer space. SDOT's making this



change to further improve safety by creating added protection between people biking and people driving.



Route 40 - Transit-Plus Multimodal Corridor

Northgate-Crown Hill-Ballard-Fremont-Westlake-Downtown (Seattle)

Coming in 2025

Upgrades to the Route 40 bus corridor include transit only lanes, new bus bulbs, upgraded sidewalks, crosswalks, and curb ramps. These investments will reduce transit travel times, improve reliability, and increase safety and transit access.





Swift Orange Line Edmonds-Lynnwood-Mill Creek Coming March 30, 2024

Community Transit is expanding its Swift bus rapid transit network by adding a third line, Swift Orange Line. The new bus rapid transit line will provide fast, frequent service linking Edmonds College, Alderwood Mall and Mill Creek, with connections to Link light rail in Lynnwood when it opens in fall 2024.
